5. STUDENT VOICE

6. TRUSTEE REPORTS

Trustee N. Hazelton shared information about a Board Chair's call last week with the Ministries of Infrastructure and Education and Child Care wherein government officials advised that capital projects for all sectors will now be managed the Ministry of Infrastructure.

Trustee N. Hazelton also shared information relating to the February 22 Provincial Council meeting that was led by the BCSTA's new Chief Executive Officer T. Davies. Trustees will soon receive an email from the BCSTA regarding proposed updates to three bylaws.

Trustee N. Hazelton reported about her experiences at the Francois Lake Elementary School and SD91 District Science Fairs on February 12 and 18, and she expressed gratitude to all the students, staff, parents, and judges who were involved in annual science fairs. Special thanks to SD91 administrative and teaching staff members T. Clark, R. Toth, and J. Soles for coordinating the District Science Fair.

7. BCSTA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

All Trustees were notified that the BCSTA Annual General Meeting will take place on April 24-25, 2025, and further information has been circulated via email.

8. <u>EDUCATION DIVISION</u>

8.1 <u>EDUCATION UPDATES</u>

A. FRASER LAKE FARM-GARDEN INTIATIVE

District Careers Coordinator D. Carpenter presented to the Board and answered questions about a new garden initiative at Fraser Lake Elementary-Secondary School that has recently received grant funding.

B. <u>SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT TO THE BOARD</u>

Superintendent A McClinton shared her regular monthly update, highlighting many visits to most SD91 schools and sites, introductory meetings with various staff members and stakeholder group representatives, a recent Indigenous group gala event, science fairs, and more. Special recognition was expressed towards staff members who devote so much time in and outside of class time to coach sports and coordinate special events for students.

Superintendent A. McClinton also reported to the Board about her attendance at the recent BCPSEA Annual General Meeting that included presentation from Minister Beare, discussions about bargaining and the trustee role in bargaining. BCPSEA will host a bargaining academy learning session from March 3-5, 2025.

C. INITIAL 2025-26 ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS

Assistant Superintendent M. Skinner reported that 2025-26 enrolment projections had been submitted to the Ministry of Education and Child Care prior to the February 14th deadline. SD91 anticipates that student enrolment will decrease by approximately 80 students, mainly due to the recent trend of fewer new Kindergarten registrations in comparison to graduating students.

D. <u>SCHOOL GROWTH PLANS</u>

The template and most current 'School Plans to Enhance Student Learning' for 14 of 16 SD91 schools were reviewed. It was noted that one school's plan would be submitted at a later date and that EBUS Academy was not required to provide a school plan due to their status as a provincial online school. Instead, EBUS Academy will present directly to the Ministry of Education and Child Care.
