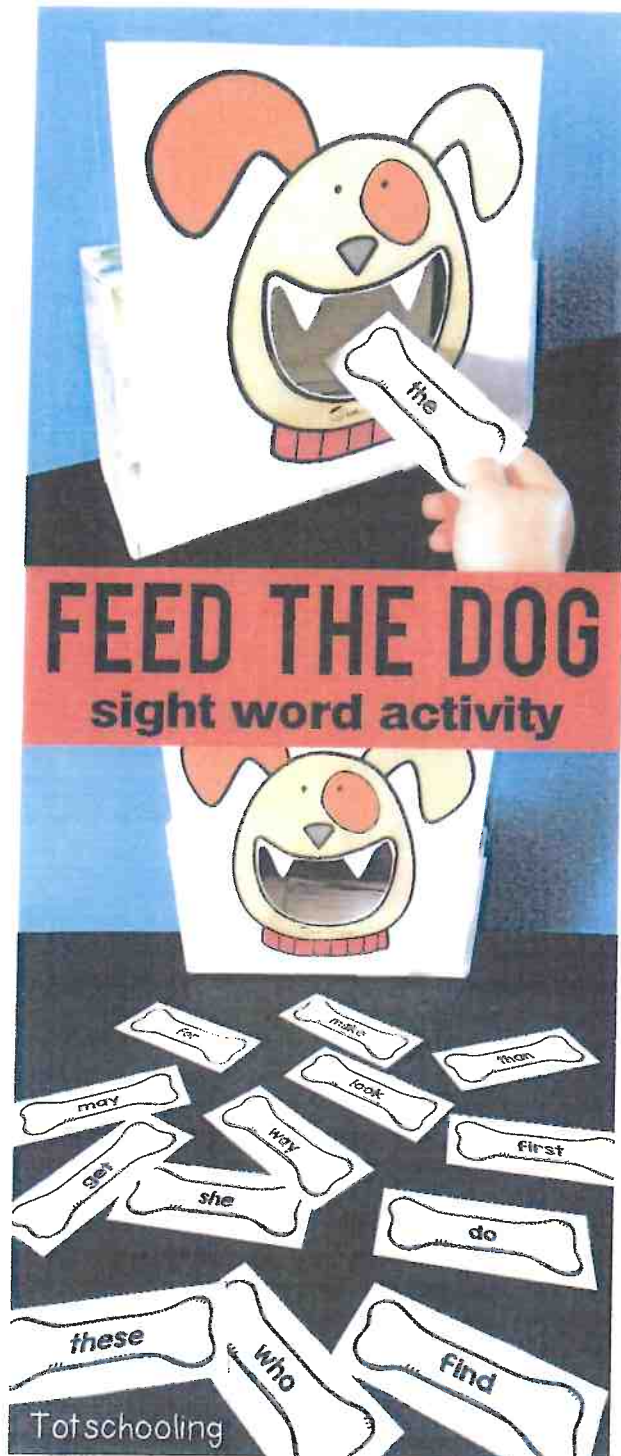


FEED THE DOG- sight word activity

Materials Needed:

- Printer
- Paper or card stock
- Laminator
- Scissors
- Tissue box, shoe box, cereal box, etc.

Instructions:

- Laminate all pages. Cut out dog's head and all the bones that you will use. Cut a hole in the dog's mouth big enough to feed the bones through. Attach dog's head to a cereal box, tissue box, shoe box, etc. and cut a hole in the box where the mouth is.

A fun way to practice sight word recognition is with this free printable game called "Feed the Dog". Forget the flash cards, this is much more motivating for kids! It features Fry's First 100 words, plus blank pages, so it's easy to customize it to your child's or student's skill level.

Extension Ideas:

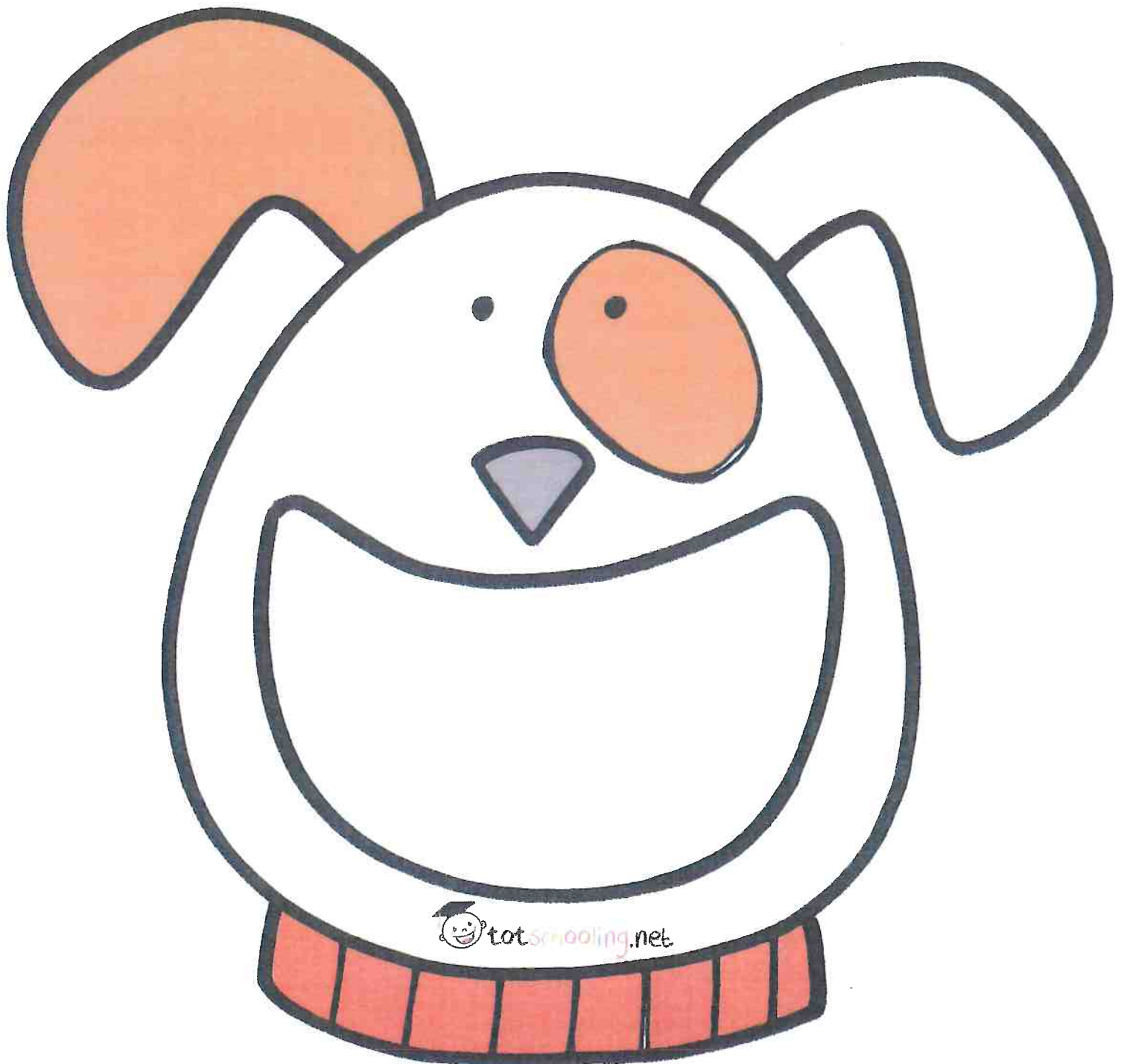
To extend the activity, you can have children write down each sight word before feeding it to the dog. This will practice reading and writing at the same time. After all the bones have been fed, the child can then read their list of words for extra practice.
