



Standard School: \$ 9,015 per school age FTE	Continuing Education: \$9,015 per school age FTE
Alternate School: \$ 9,015 per school age FTE	Online Learning: \$7,280 per school age FTE





Funding to districts experiencing enrolment decline of at least 1% when compared to the previous year


Funding Protection:
Funding to ensure that no district experiences a decline in operating grants greater than 1.5% when compared to the previous September

0.1% allocated to buffer the effects of declining enrolment

Funding Adjustments




- Preliminary allocations are adjusted after each of the enrolment counts;
 - September, February and May;
 - Funding protection and **enrolment decline** is calculated following September enrolment count only
 - Funding is disbursed in a “just in time” manner to closely match district cash needs.
 - The full operating block must be allocated by districts by June 30

2025-26 Enrolment by Grade (Standard Schools)
















Decker Lake Elementary





















Estimated Student Capacity in SD91 Schools - %












Breakdown by Function







Budget Bylaw \$80,667,505

Operating Fund
– revenue is more general in nature, some flexibility in allocations

Special Purpose Fund
– grants received by the District for specific purposes, can not be reallocated to other areas

Capital Fund – includes funding and costs for building improvements, large maintenance projects, and purchase of equipment and vehicles
