PREP

For extra durability, print the game on card stock and laminate.

Cut out the eggs and spread them face up on a flat surface. If your students are still learning the sight words, spread out groups of 6 eggs to prevent them from becoming overwhelmed.

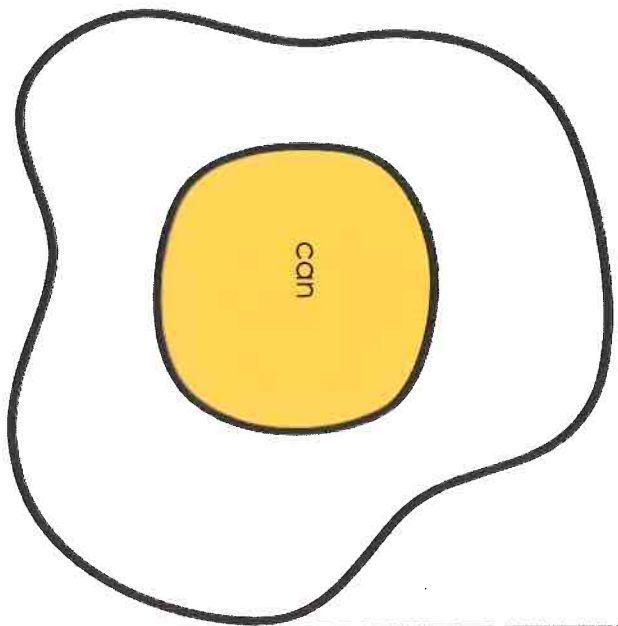
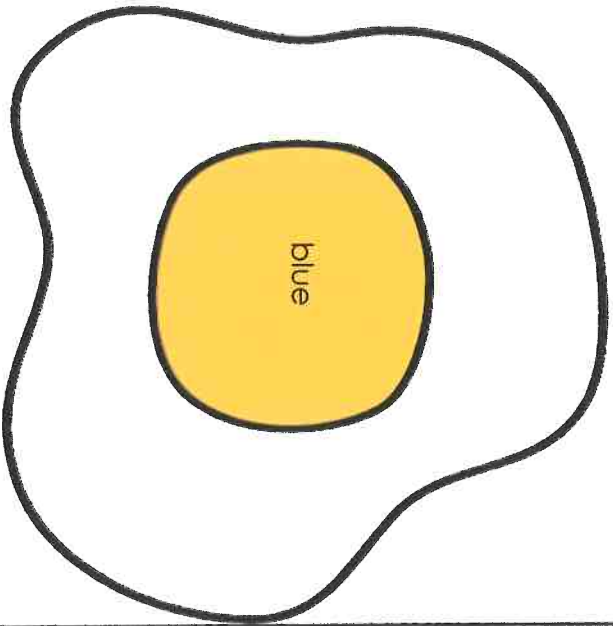
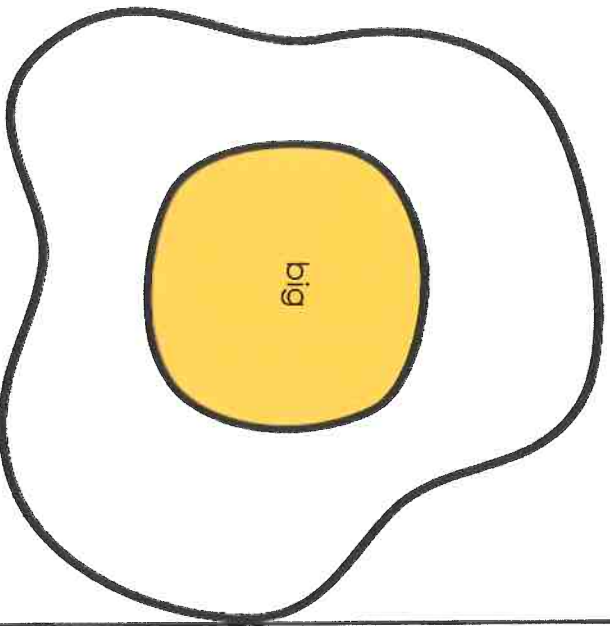
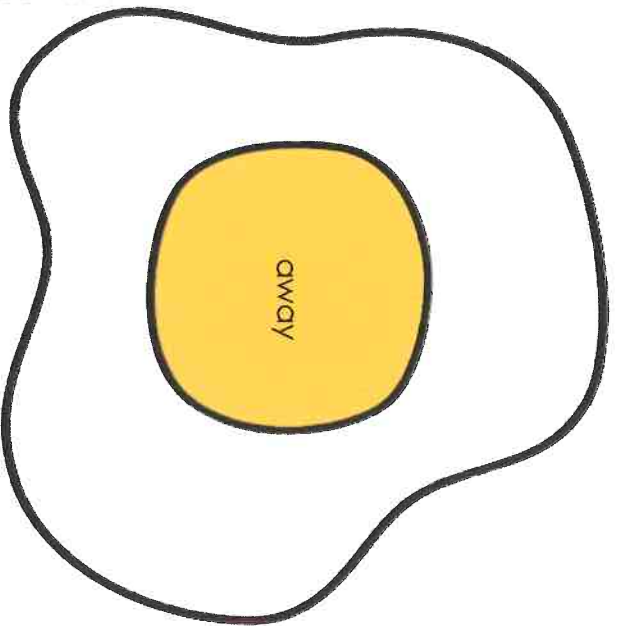
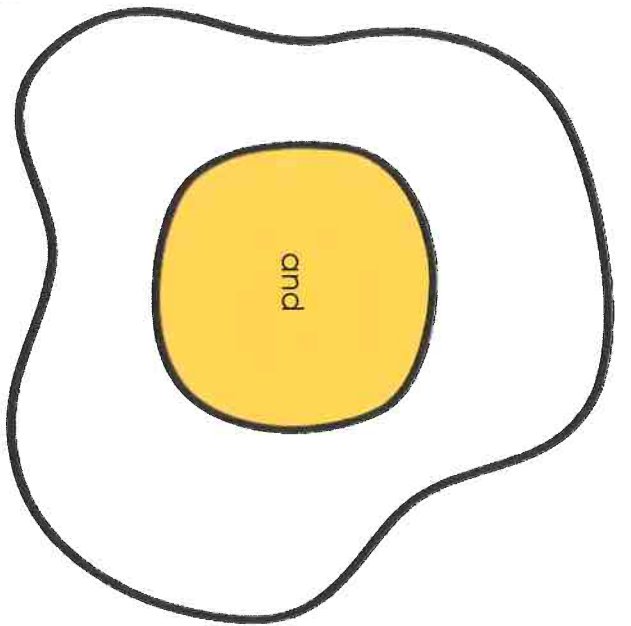
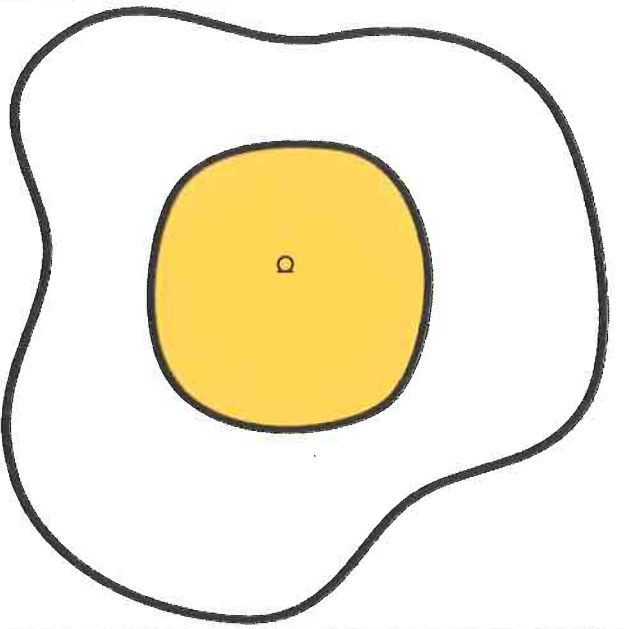

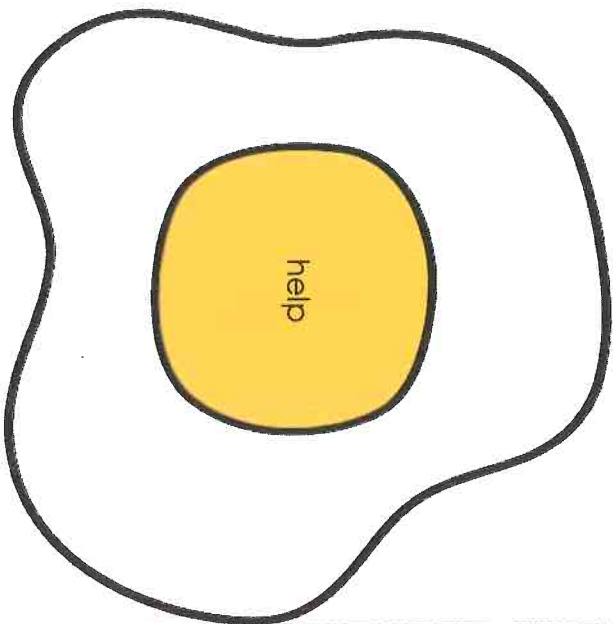
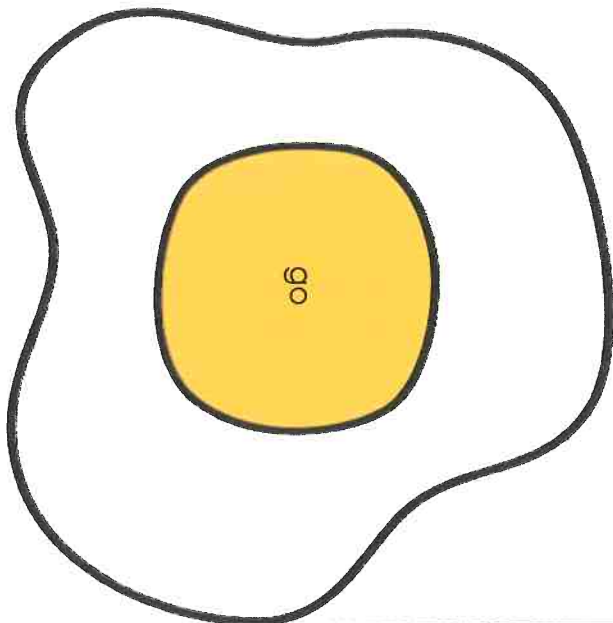
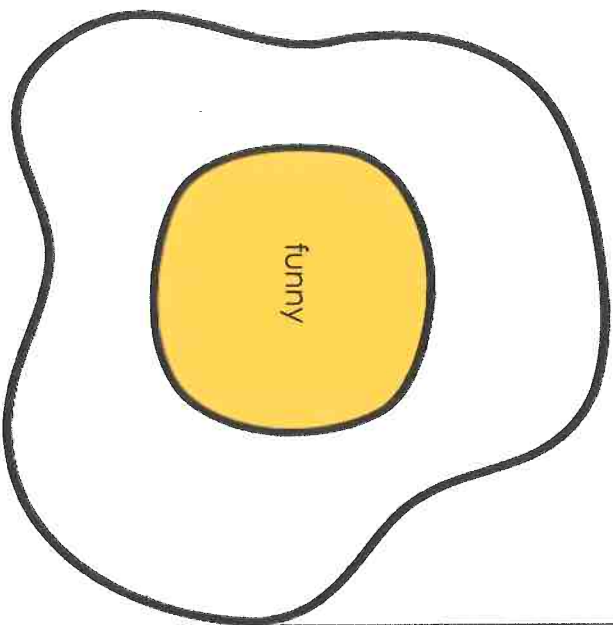
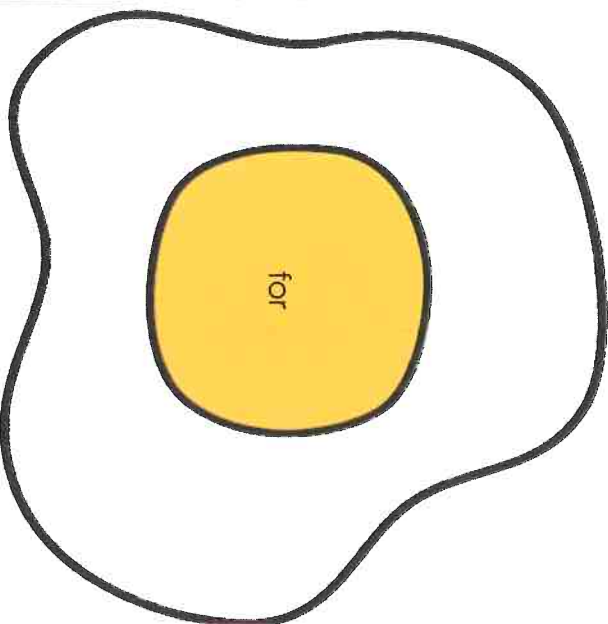
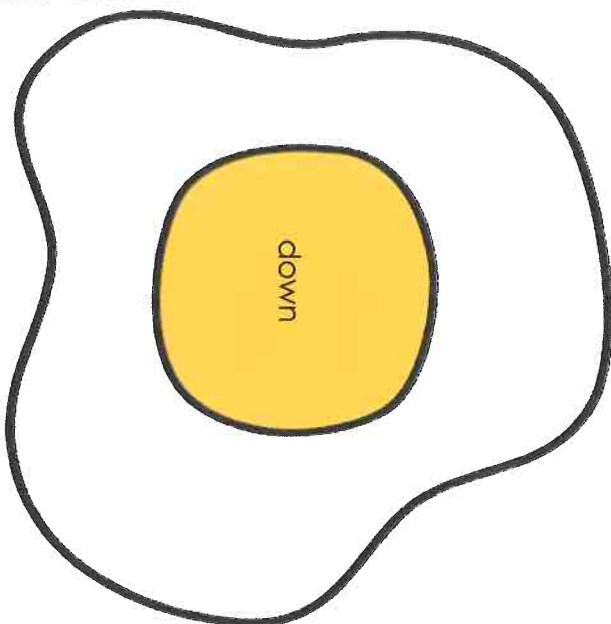
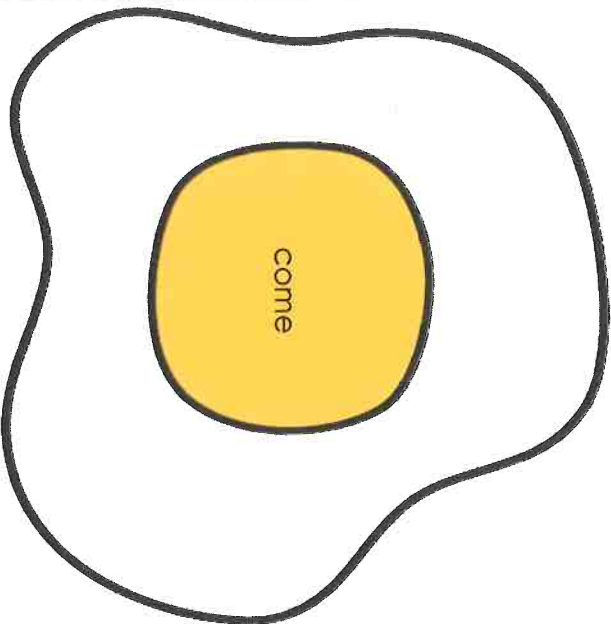
Hand a child the spatula and explain that he is the cook in this round. Ask another student {the caller} to read a sight word, spell it out loud and read it again. For example, "AND. A-N-D. AND"

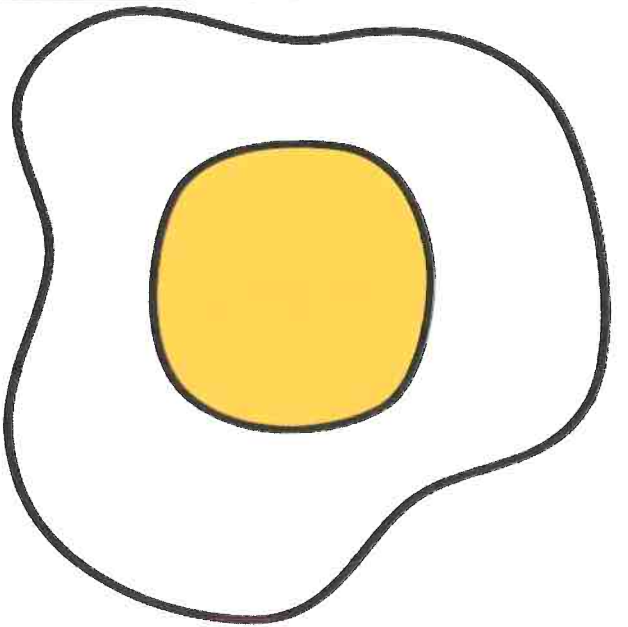
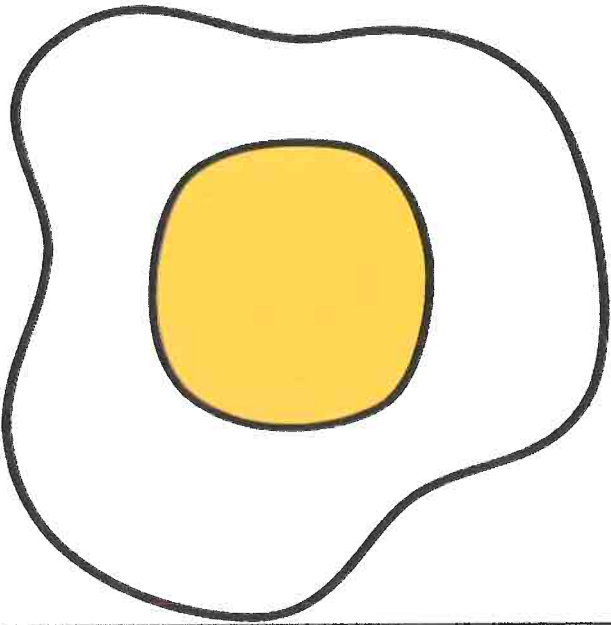
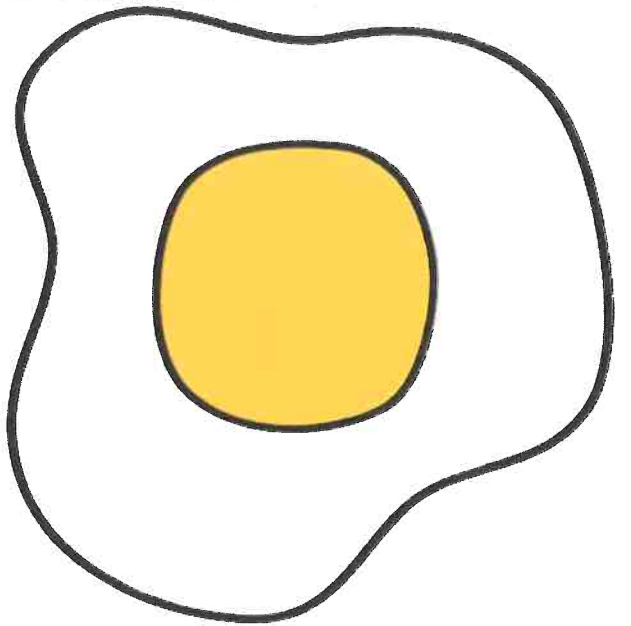
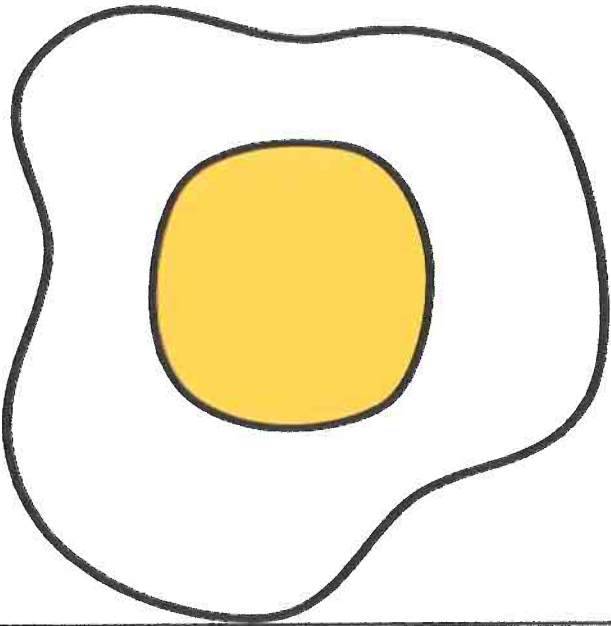
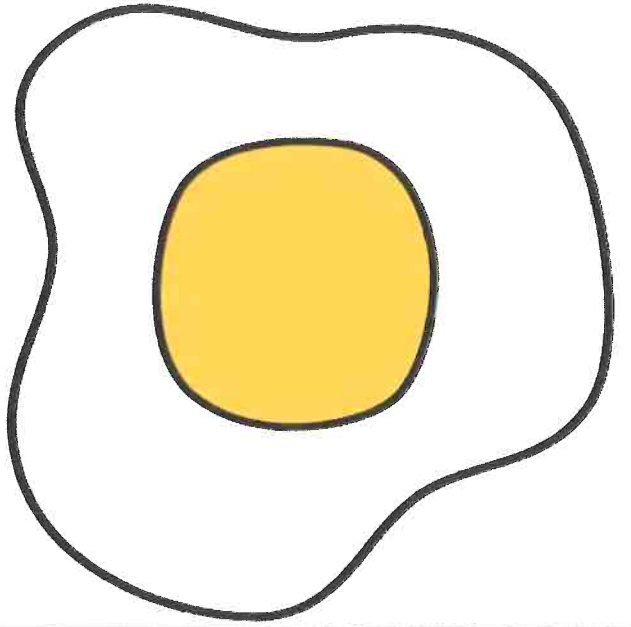
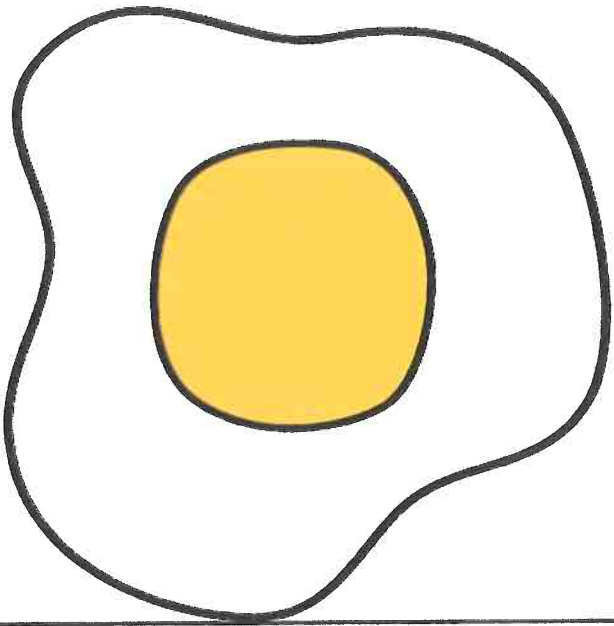
The cook finds the matching sight word egg and flips it over. Play continues until all eggs have been flipped. Then children switch roles – the cook becomes the caller and vice versa.

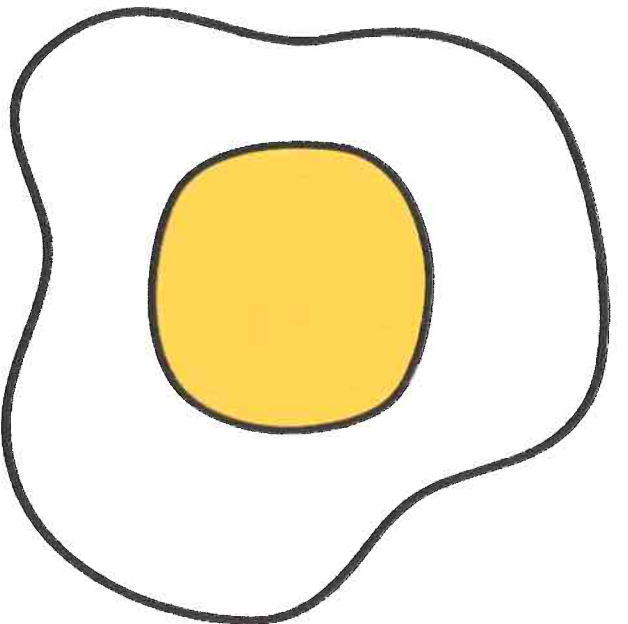
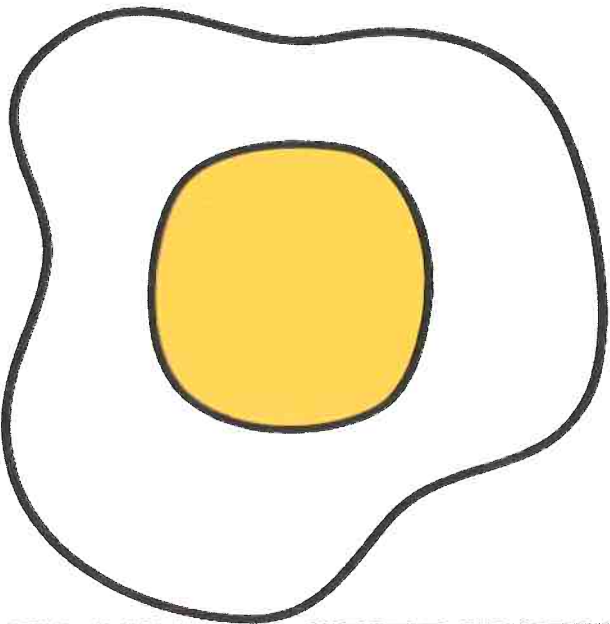
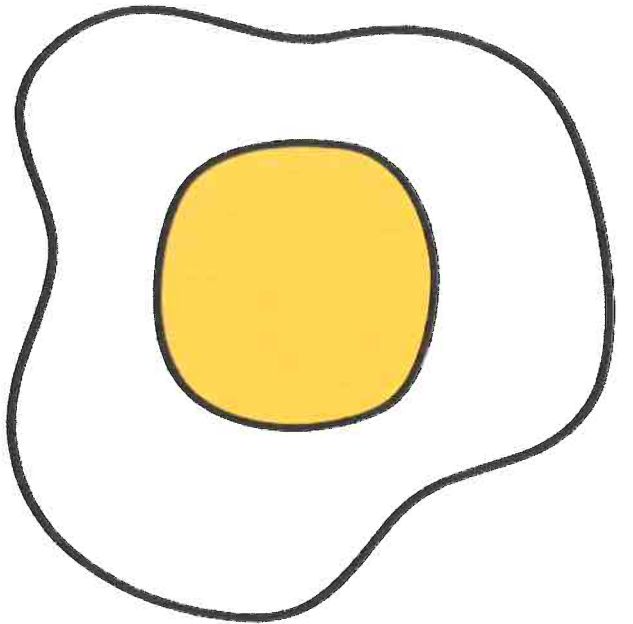
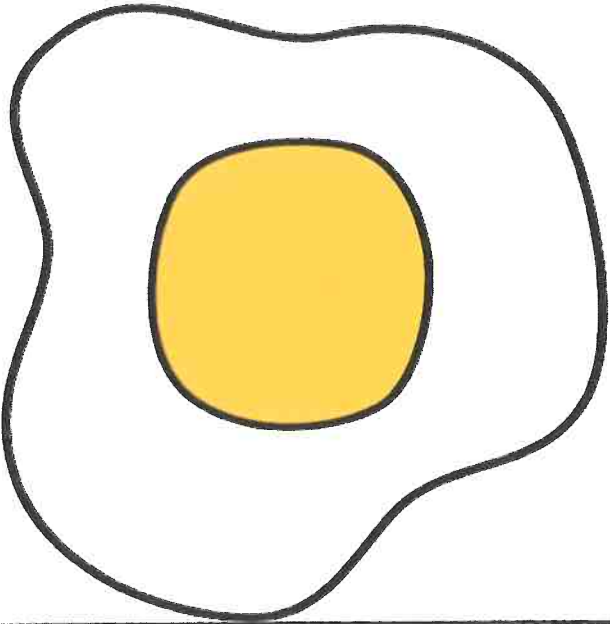
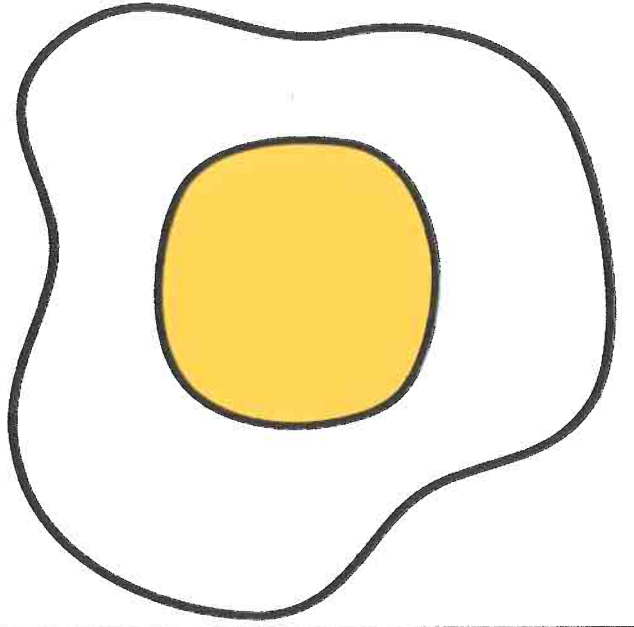
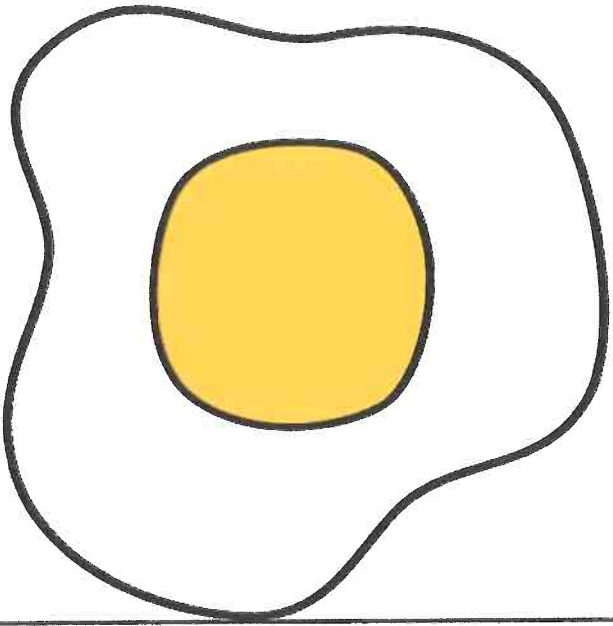
Have students write the words on their egg paper when they are finished flipping.
